## JOINT WORSHIP SERVICE AT CTS ON SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 11

10 AM – Judd Kruse presentation on his trip to Nepal and Tibet
11 AM – Joint worship service

Please bring a dish to share At 10 AM on Sunday, November 11, we will all gather at CTS for a presentation by Judd Kruse who spent three weeks traveling with the Cancer and Beyond group to Nepal and Tibet, culminating in a week-long hike around the base of Mount Kalish. Judd will talk about the work they did, the challenges of the trip, and the prayer flag ceremony at Mount Kalish. Dr. Deming, Mercy Cancer Center, was the leader of the group. He takes a group of survivors on a challenging trip every year.

This will be followed by a joint worship service and potluck at CTS. (There will not be a worship service or Sunday School at FLC on this day.)



### SAVE the DATE (S):

## WHAT HAPPENED **ANNOUNCEMENTS?**

Your pastor continues to learn about how we do worship at First Lutheran and Christ the Servant. My way of keeping announcements outside the parameter of worship was to have them before the prelude. I recently discovered "my way" was getting in the way of the musicians' roles as greeters and gatherers of the assembly with their prelude and I want to correct that. The solution - NO Announcements at all, unless a service note is needed or there is an emergency. Should it become necessary to provide a time for announcements, they will come (just as they had before I got here) just prior to the dismissal.



We will continue to learn and use a new song each month, learning the song at the beginning or end of the first worship service of the month and then using it in various places throughout the service each Sunday the rest of the month.

In October, we grew accustomed to using, "Lord, Listen to Your Children Praying" during the prayers of Intercession. This month, November, we will learn "Dancing at the Harvest" (a timely song for November) and in December, we will learn John Ylvisakar's Apostle's Creed song, "I Believe, I Do Believe."

While "Dancing at the Harvest" will become a song in our regular repertoire of hymns for worship, "Lord, Listen to Your Children Praying" and "I Believe, I Do Believe" will occasionally be substituted for the spoken prayer response and the Apostles' Creed.

The Fortress Press Wellness Book Fair for adults offers books that help you heal, grow and thrive. These books will help you deal with difficult concerns and will help open the door for continuing conversations about difficult or stigmatized topics, reinforcing the church's role as a safe, welcoming place where people can seek help and support.

The Children's' Christmas Book Fair offers special titles that will help kids thrive emotionally, socially and spiritually. The books on display include holiday titles from books and videos that tell the biblical nativity story to picture books that share the spirit and meaning of the season. Any of the non-holiday titles can be ordered at special Book Fair pricing for gift-giving. Recommended for ages 3-10, preschool through grade 4. All books are sold at discounted prices.

Stop by and look through the sample books and place your order for any of them and others being offered. The Book Fairs will close on December 5 at noon and orders will be submitted so books may be received in time for Christmas-giving.

#### Sign up any time at the Book Fair to be eligible for a monthly \$100 cash drawing.

First Lutheran Church will receive 20% of all sales over \$200 (the value of the sample books we get to keep).

Dear Partners in the Gospel,

I've been thinking about Thanksgiving. No, not the approaching holiday, but the idea of living a life of gratitude. Diana Butler Bass just released her latest From the Pastor's Desk

book, Grateful: The Transformative Power of Giving Thanks. Great timing, I say. Just in time for Thanksgiving, typically a time of overindulging, but also a mentality of thankfulness.

We have much for which to be thankful – not the least of which is the death and resurrection of Jesus, who continues to give us life, the abundant life. As Bass pointed out in a recent presentation on her book, we tend to think of giving thanks as an individual action. If you're depressed, make a list of all the things you can be thankful for; if you've hit a wall, be grateful for the slow down; when you're tired, give thanks for your bed and your home; keep a gratitude journal; send thank you notes to people from your past who helped make you who you are today...

and so on. There is some serious benefit in being personally thankful for all that we have.

But Bass suggests something beyond individual gratitude and that is the transformation that results when communities of people see themselves as grateful. She says, "Gratitude is not just a private feeling but is also inherently social, connecting us as individuals with others." She says we need to practice radical gratitude and stop thinking of thanksgiving as some kind of "pay back" for a gift. If we can do that, we can change ourselves and society. Listen to what we say in showing appreciation, "I owe you a debt of gratitude."

The Bible does not teach us to treat appreciation as a payback or an exchange for something. It's pretty obvious from this primary example: There is no reciprocity possible with respect to what Jesus did for us. Our gratitude for redemption and healing needs to be expressed in ways other than trying to "pay Jesus back." Forget the, "It's the least I can do after what Jesus did for me," and think instead of the abundance provided, the table fellowship and the sharing of gifts without any expectation of return.

It's a good book, a helpful book, and it could be life-changing if a number of people were to read and discuss her book in view of our congregation and our life together as grateful people. Bass said this about writing her book, "Part of my dream in writing this book is to help people in congregations get to levels of gratitude that they never thought about before. I would love to see churches actually live that way, and if we can live that way, then we become models for how that can happen in other places as well." Not a bad dream, Ms. Bass. Thank you.

As we gather at the end of the month to give thanks in our ecumenical community, with our families, or in service to others, it is good to give thanks for all that we can do as a community of gratitude.
