With this ministry, if the weather impacts us, or someone is sick, shut in, or out of town, all will be able to listen to the weekly sermon and prayers on the radio. You can listen on your personal radio, or via of the "Simple Radio" App on your Smart Phone, or a Radio App on your computer. Just turn on your radio or download one of the apps and you'll be ready to listen.

Now, if you would like to sponsor a weekly broadcast for any occasion, an anniversary, a birthday, in memory or honor of someone, or some other reason, we invite you to consider giving a gift to sponsor the broadcast. Pastoral Pondering

On the first day of the week, Mary stood outside an open tomb believing someone had taken Jesus' body, weeping. It had been a horrendous few days with the arrest of her Lord, his trial, conviction, and crucifixion. Now, thinking someone has taken his body, confronted her with more pain and suffering. When, suddenly, to her amazement, the risen Lord stands before her and calls her by name - "Mary." Imagine the joy and comfort of hearing your name spoken by the one who you thought was dead.

Imagine yourself standing before the tomb early in the morning years ago, greeted by an angel, who says to you: "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, … Suddenly Jesus met them and said, 'Greetings!'" (Matthew 28:5-9). What a joyful shock to be greeted by one you thought was dead, the risen Lord Jesus. One who has conquered and destroyed the power of death itself.

Today, we are living through the pain and suffering of a shocking virus that is shutting down factories, forcing people to work from home, closing schools, overwhelming hospitals and medical resources – all of which seems unbelievable, almost like death itself. Facing an unknown future, the likes of which history has never seen before, I pray that it is with courage and hope that we face that which is before us. Knowing that the comforting words of the risen Lord, who said: "Remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20) are as valid today as they were centuries ago.

As we celebrate Easter with the fantastic news that the risen Lord, who conquered death, will also guide us in destroying the Corvid-19 virus plaguing our world. Sometimes as we look at the pain and suffering around us, it becomes important to look beyond a specific moment and realize - the love of our Lord, the risen Lord, continues to bear our burdens inspiring us with hope. St. Paul wrote to the church at Rome: "suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts." (Rom. 5:3-5)

Our Lord knows our pain and suffering and is more than willing to walk with us into the future. Therefore, I pray we will not lose hope, but remain steadfast and confident, knowing with assurance that God is with us.

St. Paul also wrote: "Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you." (Phil. 4:8-9)

CANCELLED STAMPS: We are doing very well




collecting cancelled stamps. We have an opportunity in April to hand deliver all that we have collected so far. If you have a pile at home, please remember
