
REMEMBERING ALL GOD'S SAINTS

Pastoral Pondering

Last Monday as I headed home, I watched a farmer harvesting his corn crop. There was a huge semi loaded with corn at the edge of the field, and the picker was moving down the field harvesting more. As I watched, I couldn't help but think that soon our calendars will flip from September to October; and, not only will we flip the calendar page, but our seasons will change as well. The eighty-degree days will quickly become fifty and sixty-degree days, the warm nights will give way to cooler temperatures, and there will be a chill in the air. Those bright green leaves, which we have enjoyed all summer, have begun to change color - and now red, yellow, and orange leaves hang in beautiful display on the trees. Pumpkins, gourds, and mums sit in full display on many a front step. And soon, we'll be racking leaves Fall has come!

And with the coming of October comes Halloween, a day to dress up in costume and run door to door asking for candy. Oh, how I love to greet the kids standing at the front door in their wonderful costumes – space astronauts, princesses, cowboys and cowgirls, plus a variety of other magnificent costumes – what a fabulous day!

But also, in October there is a moment when we celebrate our Lutheran heritage. October 31st (Reformation Day), a day to celebrate God's work through his servant, Martin Luther, who fought to preserve the message of the gospel as the free gift of God's grace in Jesus Christ through faith alone.

On October 31st, 1517 Martin Luther nailed 95 theses (or disputes) on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. Luther taught at the University in Wittenberg and preached at the local Church. The theses were written against the teachings of indulgences, purgatory, and other beliefs and practices of the church in the 16th century that were inconsistent with the teaching of the Bible. As a pastor of Wittenberg's Church, Luther was concerned about the large number of people who no longer came to confession, and who sought to justify this with an indulgence they bought. Indulgences were slips of paper, sold by officials of the church and signed by the pope. These slips of paper granted God's forgiveness of sins and reduced time in purgatory for the purchaser. The church was selling God's gift of forgiveness of sins that was intended to be free!

In order to preserve the true teachings of Scripture, Luther began to challenge the leaders of the church. As Paul wrote to the Romans Luther asserted: "I am not ashamed of the gospel; it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who has faith...For in it the righteousness of God is revealed through faith for faith; as it is written, 'The one who is righteous will live by faith.'" (Rom. 1:16-17)

Luther began to proclaim, we are saved:

By "**Grace alone:**" Christian faith is the assurance that salvation is based on the unearned free gift of God's grace. Though we are sinners, disobedient children, deserving of God's wrath and anger, we receive the riches of God's love and forgiveness.

By "**Faith alone:**" God's gift of grace is received through faith in what Jesus has done for us. Our good works and the good things that we do flow out of having a right relationship with God, but these good things do not have the power to make us right with God. In Ephesians Paul writes, "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast" (Eph. 2:8-9).

By "**Scripture alone:**" The Bible is the Word of God, and It alone is the source for what we believe and what we practice in the Christian church. All other gifts that God has given to us and to the church such as tradition, experience, and human reason function to serve our understanding of the Holy Scriptures.

By "**Christ alone:**" Our basis and assurance of salvation is the person of Jesus Christ, his life, death, and resurrection. The Gospel writer John tells us that, "God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). Jesus is the only way to the Father (John 14:6).

So, as we walk through October, I encourage you to take some time to remember the Reformation, the core teachings of Christianity that were preserved by God through Luther, and be comforted by the fact that God continues to work through His people (the church) - so that all might find refuge and safety in that rock of Jesus Christ. As Luther said in stanza two of his famous hymn, *A Mighty Fortress Is Our God*: "now a champion comes to fight, whom God himself elected. Ask who this may be: Lord of hosts is he! Christ Jesus our Lord, God's only Son adored. He holds the field victorious."
