


### FLC CHRISTMAS PROGRAM

# Pastoral Pondering . . . .

As we come to December this year, it is with excitement and wonder that I ponder what God is thinking and planning for all of us. Remember the angel's message to Mary years ago, the shock of what God was preparing – it caused her to be perplexed and ponder! What was God saying to her about the future and about her life?

*In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David." (Luke 1:26-32)*

As the angel spoke to Mary causing her to be perplexed and ponder, just what kind of greeting did the angel bring? And, what does that angel say to us, as we hear it during the darkest time of the year? What is God saying to the people of First Lutheran as we approach Christmas? What is God putting on our calendars for the coming weeks? I'm sure there stands before all of us is a variety of thoughts and things.

And then on December 24th we'll gather to celebrate that miracle of love remembering a tiny child that came to be laid in the manger straw centuries ago – a miracle that has brought light and hope into a dark and troubled world.

I know it's a busy time for all of you, as you decorate the house and tree, prepare delicious food for the extended family, and shop for just that special gift – all of which happens because God so loved the world that He came to walk among us.
