## Pastoral Pondering . . . .

"Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name." John 20:30-31


There are many reasons I like the month of May. The month of May has many signs of new life, beginning with the change from winter to spring. Soon, hopefully very soon, the sun will shine with increasing power to warm the earth and the air. There is the aroma of freshly turned earth that fills the air as we drive through the countryside and see the tractors in the field, preparing the earth for planting new seeds. At the end of May, we will celebrate a time of Confirmation, as confirmation students take the next step in their faith as they affirm their baptismal vows, confessing their faith in the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit and promising to live out their faith in the midst of the communion of saints. And, as the month continues, we get excited in seeing the different shades of green - the grass turns a vibrant green, the trees become filled with new leaves that have their own shades of green, and in the middle of the month, we begin to look for rows of green corn and beans. It's exciting to see this new life all around us. Then there is high school and college graduation - students have achieved a milestone in their life as one adventure ends, and a new adventure begins. So, as you can see, there is a lot of newness of life celebrated in the month of May.

As John tells the story of Easter, he adds that Jesus did many other signs, which were written that we might have life in his name. Right before this, John related the story of Easter morning and the night of Easter. Early in the morning, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb, but discovered it was empty. Immediately, she runs and tells Peter and John. They check out the tomb and discover it is empty. Now, Mary hangs back, crying, for she misses Jesus. Then Jesus appears to her, and she goes running to all the disciples and tells them, "I have seen the Lord." The disciples are not so sure this is true. That evening, behind locked doors, the disciples are gathered in the Upper Room, Jesus appears in their midst, saying to them, "Peace be with you." The disciples are still doubtful, thinking they are seeing a ghost. But then Jesus shows them his hands with the wounds of the nails, and he pulls back his robe to show them the wound in his side. Now, the disciples are glad to see the Lord.

After Jesus has assured his disciples that it is indeed him, and sharing his peace, Jesus gives the disciples the Holy Spirit by breathing on them. And, he says to them, "If you forgive the sins of any, they will be forgiven them. If you retain the sins of any, they are retained." These words of Jesus give us reason to pause; we know how the disciples abandoned Jesus as he was arrested. Now, the first words Jesus gives to his disciples are, "Peace be with you." Jesus doesn't hold their sin against them, he doesn't ask them, "Why did you abandon me?" No, Jesus offers his peace, forgiveness, and reconciliation. Jesus stands in their midst demonstrating his victory over sin and death with instructions to forgive sins. To be forgiven is to be set free from the guilt and the hurt sin created. To be forgiven is to be set free to have a new beginning, a chance to be reconciled, to begin the relationship anew. To be forgiven is to have newness of life, peace and joy. Before they can face Jesus to ask for his forgiveness, Jesus offers his peace and forgiveness. Then our risen Lord gives his disciples a mission - as the Father sent me, so I send you, forgive the sins of people and they will be forgiven. In forgiveness, Jesus offers all the gift of new life.

May is the season of new life. We witness the newness of life as spring wakes the earth from its winter slumber. We see new life all around us in the plants and new baby calves in the field. These are all a witness to the newness of life we have in our Lord Jesus Christ. Truly we have newness of life in his name.
