Pastoral Pondering

Holding Hands! Isn't it wonderful to walk with another person hand in hand, chatting, and experiencing life through someone else's eyes?

Jesus walked the lonely pathways of Palestine years ago encountering people where they were (in the big city, along the river bank, at wayside inns, and in quiet places). Where ever Jesus walked and with whom ever he talked, the grace of God came alive. In Jesus we witness the love and forgiveness of a gracious God, who cares so much about us, that he is willing to walk where we walk, listen to our thoughts, and offer us blessings at some of the amazing times in life - one of the most wonderful gifts is the love of another person.

I still get "ducky bumps" when I see a young couple walk down the street holding hands, laughing and chatting, celebrating the joy of a date. It seems to me that young people exemplify the innocence and enthusiasm of life and love.

As Jesus came not to condemn the world but to save it, to give his life that we might live, and to help us see the joy found in God's kingdom, may we find the wonderful joy that comes in walking together. Jesus said "whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me." Our neighbors see and experience the love of God in the words and deeds we share with each other.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer in his little book "The Cost of Discipleship" helps us understand that grace is not cheap, it calls for personal commitment and involvement. For Bonhoeffer that meant: - living what he wrote, - faith manifested in action, - persecution faced with courage and perseverance. He understood sanctification (growing in grace) with being part of the Body of Christ, in which we are encouraged to avoid being a "lone wolf" Christian. Our spiritual health is directly tied to the church - so that we can minister to others and be ministered to as well. He helps us understand how our relationship with Christ prods us to examine our relationship with each other and our neighbor.

I pray we are all living our faith in ways that exemplify the presence and teaching of our Lord Jesus Christ.

John in his first epistle writes: "Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. . . . This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us." (1 Jn. 3:7-12)
