# Pastoral Pondering . . .

As I begin to write this month's Pondering, my thoughts are of casting a fly on the trout stream in Colorado, visiting friends and family, and the oppressive heat that has invaded Iowa. Perhaps my thoughts are also about reality – joy and challenge, relaxation and work. Yesterday after leaving church I went home and mowed the lawn and last Sunday after worship at Christ the Servant as we headed home, we had a flat tire. As the tire went thump, thump on the highway; I thought, this is a nice way to begin some time off.

Pulling over to the side of the road on Highway 2, I got out and checked the tire, and sure enough the tire was flat. So, I opened the trunk, got the jack out and began to jack the car up – but before I could do that, I had to get the manual out of the glove compartment to read where I was to place the jack before jacking the car up. Once I understood where to place the jack, I started to jack up the car. As I worked, my wife called John Forbes to come and help; then a lady from Arkansas stopped and asked if she would help, and then Doug Thiel saw us and stopped. The lady from Arkansas said she could replace the tire and moved me aside, took the jack wrench and began to jack up the car, take off the tire, put on the spare, and honestly she did it much faster than I could have done it. Doug got the spare out of the trunk, gave the spare tire to the lady, and then John arrived. The lady from Arkansas was the daughter of a former U.S. Marine soldier – who taught her how to take care of her automobiles. Her Dad said "if you're going to drive, you need to know how to take care of your car." And she certainly knows how to care for an automobile. When everything was fixed, I asked her how much I owed her and she said "nothing," reached out her hand and said "hope you have a wonderful drive home." She was an angel God sent to help us on a warm Sunday afternoon.

So, as I look forward to two weeks of vacation, I go with the comforting thought that God is still active in the lives of His creation. Even when I had planned to mow the lawn, God brought clouds and cool breeze to watch over me.

Therefore, as the Psalmist says: "This is the day that the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it" (Ps. 118:24).
