## Pastoral Pondering . . .

I am grateful to God ... when I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. Recalling your tears, I long to see you so that I may be filled with joy. I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that lived first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, lives in you. 2 Timothy 1:3-5

I remember with fondness and gratitude the letters Carolyn, now my wife, wrote, faithfully and dependably, during the year when I was in England. We were separated by miles and miles plus the Atlantic Ocean but her letters, in her neat, careful script, (this was before emails and social media were a thing!) that brought her love half-way around the world and made our connection stronger. During the year of our separation, the Cuban Missile Crisis erupted in the Caribbean Sea and B-52 bombers flew over England heavily loaded with bombs. It was an intense time and I longed for the joy of traveling "over the river and through the woods" to join my family and those I loved for holidays and special occasions. Today those letters remind me that even though we are sometimes separated by miles upon miles, love brings comfort and assurance – they have a wonderful way of uniting people. Those letters certainly brought joy to me in the midst of life with all its upheavals.

Paul's second letter to Timothy is like those letters I received from Carolyn – personal, affectionate, encouraging. Paul longs to see his young co-worker in the flesh. He knows there is no substitute for the joy of being physically together. Because we are, as Paul says elsewhere, members of the one body of Christ, we need each other to be whole. No one can be a Christian alone. This is a primary reason why we desire and seek to invite everyone back into the rhythm of in-person worship and activities at First Lutheran and Christ the Servant Lutheran. In baptism God has made us brothers and sisters - siblings called into community together. Ours is an EMBODIED faith, and you, dearly beloved, are physical embodiments of the gracious presence of the triune God. Gathering together around God's word and sacraments, beholding each other, making new connections, strengthening bonds for mission, discovering gifts—all this grows from being together.

October is a month of harvests. It's the time Carolyn and I made our annual pilgrimage to the nursery to purchase mums, pumpkins, gourds, and decorations for the front of the house. It's also a time when we begin to see farmers harvesting their corn and beans. Plus, we remember the days when milk, bread, butter, and eggs were almost non-existent in the grocery store because deer hunters were stocking up. And then, there are those homes inundated with toilet paper hanging from every tree branch in the front yard. Soon the maples will turn orange and red, and jack-o-lanterns will adorn many a front step. In many ways we see God's benevolent and, abundant design unfolding before our eyes.

Just as Christ did not live for himself alone, we do not live for ourselves alone. The gifts and resources with which God has blessed us are meant to be celebrated and shared. Just as Carolyn shared her love through faithful letters, I pray you may share the excitement of the Fall and find great joy in walking with your friends and neighbors, those close and special to you. God's love and creation are always new each and every morning. Enjoy the Fall!
