Pastoral Pondering

There's an interesting quote that applies to the First Sunday of Advent (December 3), from a book you may have read to your children or grandchildren, or that you may remember from your own childhood. The book is by Dr. Seuss, and is entitled "One Fish, Two Fish, Red Fish, Blue Fish." The quote to consider is brief:

From there to here, from here to there, funny things are everywhere.

Funny things are everywhere! And there are two things funny about this First Sunday of Advent, the start of a new church year. The first of them is that, here at the start of a new year, we don't look back to the beginning, but we look forward to the end. Here on the first day of the new church year, we do not focus on the past, but we anticipate the future where Christ promises to meet us.

The second funny thing about today is related to the first. When we look forward to the end, when we anticipate the future, we do not treat this conclusion as some distant, far-off event. It is near at hand. It may be as close as the next second. So imminent is it, in fact, that the future comes and takes up residence in the present. The Christ who will arrive with power and great glory at the end of time comes to us also before the end of time.

Looking forward to this month, I'm excited about going to the movie with the youth on Wednesday, December 13, at 6:30 pm. It is our plan to arrive shortly after the doors open at 5:30 pm so we can get some popcorn. The youth are inviting the whole town, friends, neighbors, and everyone else they can think of. Hopefully you'll join the youth to see the film *Journey to Bethlehem*.

Then there are two midweek Advent services at 6:30 pm on Wednesday December 6 and December 20 in the Fireside Room, where there will be soup supper and a video to inspire and provoke some discussion along with prayer and song.

In January, we'll conclude our journey through "The Story." It has been a wonderful way to become more acquainted with God's revelation and the history of His people. There are four chapters remaining and we'll read and discuss those chapters in January.

Finally, Carolyn and I have given some though and prayer as to what we should give to the Lord in the new year. We recognize the cost of living and increasing prices are affecting everyone of us, and we want to do our part to meet the challenges and opportunities awaiting us. So, with joy we'll increase our gift each week to both of the congregations. It is our pattern to sit down at the first of each month and write checks for both congregations for every Sunday – we enjoy giving to the Lord before we pay our monthly expenses. I pray and encourage each of you to consider increasing your gift to the church as God continues to bless you.

Blessings to all, and let our Advent Christmas journey be just a start as to where Christ will lead us!
